- From the earliest military photography to recent born digital images
- All major conflicts: Civil War, Spanish-American War, Philippine Insurrection, World War I (WWI), World War II (WWII), Korean War, Vietnam War, Cold War-era, Persian Gulf War, and recent operations in Iraq and Afghanistan
- Largest known Civil War photograph collection including images taken by Matthew Brady
- U.S. Army Signal Corps photos from WWI and WWII
- Other large photo collections including the Military Assistance Command Vietnam (MACV) and the General Omar N. Bradley, just to name a few

Manuscript Collections



- Personal papers and artifacts of Soldiers (Private to General Officer)
- Portions of original War Department Library from George Washington's Presidency
- Most comprehensive collection of Army senior leader papers in existence
- Home to the Chief of Staff of the Army office files and personal papers
- Finest collection of unit histories

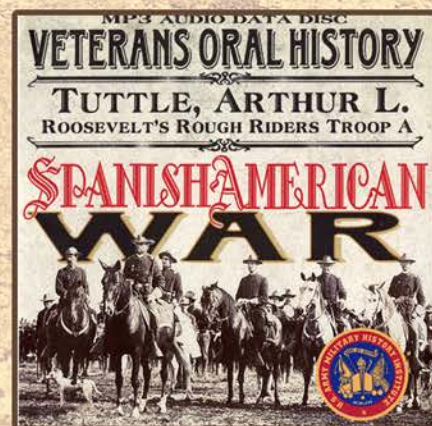
- Spanish-American War to Persian Gulf War

- Army produced films, documentaries, and other associated programs, such as *Big Picture*
- Soldier-recorded, directed, and produced personal visual histories using 8mm and 16mm film
- Collections focused on conflict periods from pre-WWI to today

Military History Publications

- Army's central repository for Army Regulations, Field Manuals, General Orders, Pamphlets, and Technical Manuals
- 337,000 military publications (over 30,000 available digitally)
- Comprehensive inventories available digitally

Oral Histories

- Audio Recordings beginning with Spanish-American War Veterans (oldest known personal accounts by Soldiers in audio format) to today's Soldiers
- Soldier oral histories from WWI, WWII, Korea, Vietnam, and DSDS are digitally available
